Instead of paying full price for prescription medications, members may pay a preferred rate (a discounted amount) to participating pharmacies.

- *Locate the nearest participating Aetna Rx Discount Network Pharmacy Card retail pharmacy.*

To find a participating pharmacy:

- > Use our DocFind® directory, available through our website at www.aetna.com.
- > Call the Aetna Member Services toll-free number on your Aetna medical ID card.
- > Ask your current retail pharmacist if his or her pharmacy participates in the program.

- *When you are filling a new prescription, present your Aetna medical ID card to the pharmacist along with your prescription form.*

If you previously participated in another discount prescription program, make sure your pharmacist has the correct information about you and your covered dependents, including accurate dates of birth.

- *Pay the amount of Aetna's negotiated discount for the prescription directly to the pharmacy.*

Saving Money on Prescriptions

- You get better results when you become an informed consumer. Always ask your doctor about the medication he or she is prescribing. What are the side effects? How will the drug interact with other medications you are currently taking?

- Ask your doctor if a generic version of your medication would be appropriate. In general, generic medications cost less than their brand-name counterparts.

Generic medications are equivalent to the brand-name drugs they replace. Generics have the same active ingredients and dosage amounts as the brand-name drug. Brand-name drugs and their generic equivalents are approved by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) before they can be sold.
