

Coverage of contraceptives and other services, drugs, devices, products and procedures

Oregon health benefit plans provide comprehensive reproductive health care coverage. Coverage includes:

- 1. Well-woman care**
- 2. Counseling for sexually transmitted infections, including, but not limited to, human immunodeficiency virus (HIV) and acquired immune deficiency syndrome (AIDS)**
- 3. Screening for the following conditions:**
 - a. Chlamydia
 - b. Gonorrhea
 - c. Hepatitis B
 - d. Hepatitis C
 - e. HIV and AIDS
 - f. Human papillomavirus
 - g. Syphilis
 - h. Anemia
 - i. Urinary tract infection
 - j. Pregnancy
 - k. Rh incompatibility
 - l. Gestational diabetes
 - m. Osteoporosis
 - n. Breast cancer
 - o. Cervical cancer
- 4. Screening to determine whether counseling related to the BRCA1 or BRCA2 genetic mutations is indicated, and, if indicated, counseling related to the BRCA1 or BRCA2 genetic mutations**
- 5. Screening and appropriate counseling or interventions for tobacco use, and domestic and interpersonal violence**
- 6. Folic acid supplements**
- 7. Abortion**
- 8. Breastfeeding comprehensive support, counseling, and supplies**
- 9. Breast cancer chemoprevention counseling**
- 10. Contraceptive drugs, devices, or products approved by the FDA**
- 11. Voluntary sterilization**

Coverage is generally provided with no deductible or cost-sharing, unless you are covered under a qualified high-deductible health plan. However, if you are covered under a group plan purchased by a religious employer, your employer may elect to not include coverage for contraceptives or abortion procedures.
